We are nearly two years into a pandemic that disrupted global health care and the supply lines that support it. Yet Gift of Life not only maintained our operations, we advanced several major initiatives and achieved critical milestones in our mission to save lives.

Our incredible donors are so excited when they learn they are a match for a patient, and are proud to take time from their own busy lives to help someone in need. Many of them say they donate not only for the patient's sake, but also for the family and friends who make up that patient's world. Once again, we surpassed the number of



completed transplants done in the previous year – no small feat considering the impact the pandemic has had on donors' lives, the courier network, and transplant centers.

In 2021, Gift of Life began a new venture that will increase our lifesaving capabilities. We launched Gift of Life Biologics, a service that partners with medical research organizations to engage in the production of new and groundbreaking cellular therapy products to fight cancer as well as other diseases.

The Adelson Collection Center achieved its first big milestone, 500 stem cell collections since it opened in fall 2019. We celebrated in true Gift of Life form by bringing a donor and recipient together at our offices for their heartwarming and emotional first meeting.

We closed 2021 with 283 transplants facilitated – an incredible 49 more than in 2020 and the most ever for Gift of Life – and which also brings us to more than 4,000 transplants completed since our founding. We are rapidly closing in on 400,000 active donors in the registry and our recruitment department grew our Campus Ambassadors to more than 500 students in 2021.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, our staff, and the patients we serve around the world, thank you for the ongoing support you provide and for being with us every day on this incredible journey.

Our COVID Precautions Continue to Keep Donors and Staff Safe







In 2021, we continued to fight blood cancer concurrently with the persistent COVID-19 pandemic continuing to affect our operations.

Gift of Life has maintained rigorous entry restrictions, temperature checks, and masking requirements within our facilities. Combined with regularly scheduled deep cleaning and sanitizing, our policies have proved successful for the safety of our donors and staff members.

Donors are invited to arrive at our facility several days in advance and receive their Neupogen injections at the hotel or in the collection center. This mitigates last minute travel complications and helps ensure that donors are healthy on their donation day.

Stem cell collections continue to be cryopreserved so unpredictable travel issues do not interrupt critical, lifesaving transplant schedules. Cryopreservation is now done within our own facility with a high level of quality control.

As hospitals around the country experience COVID surges that affect their operations, Gift of Life continues to provide a safe, out-of-hospital collection center where donors can be re-routed so blood stem cell donations can go forward in a timely way.

Redefining Cell and Gene Therapy Starting Material

Today, incredible advances are being made in immunotherapies that begin with blood stem cells, the same cells we currently use for transplantation to cure blood cancer and more than 70 other diseases. There is now a significant demand from medical research and biopharmaceutical firms for peripheral blood stem cells to form the building blocks for next generation living drugs.

Gift of Life has stepped up to meet this exciting moment in medical innovation by creating the Gift of Life Biologics division.

"Our goal for Biologics is to be a single source for the new era of therapeutics by tapping into our donor registry, collection center, cell therapy laboratory, quality systems and information technology, all housed under one roof at Gift of Life's 32,000 s.f. headquarters," said Gift of Life Founder and CEO Jay Feinberg.

With more than 390,000 donors in the registry who are already tissue-type tested, and an in-house apheresis facility to collect stem cells, Gift of Life is able to provide medical research and development organizations with the cells needed to create new medications.

At that time, Wendy's Donor Circle had added more than 90,000 volunteer donors to the registry, resulting in 1,083 matches and an incredible 148 transplants. 



Rebecca joined Gift of Life's registry during her Birthright Israel trip in 2013. She was an excellent match, and the transplant was completed in late 2017.

Gift of Life Celebrates it's 500th Collection In-house

On July 23, 2021 Gift of Life celebrated the 500th blood stem cell collection completed at the Dr. Miriam and Sheldon G. Adelson Gift of Life–Be the Match Stem Cell Collection Center, our state-of-the-art apheresis center that opened in October 2019. The Collection Center is located in Gift of Life's headquarters, along with the Center for Cell and Gene Therapy, BioBank, donor services and operational facilities. Gift of Life is the first marrow registry in the world to build a fully integrated collection center within its registry.

To kick off the event, Omardeen "Dee" Woodley, R.N., the director of the collection center, welcomed transplant recipient David Fromson, a 49-year-old project manager from Denver, Colo. Dave is a survivor of colorectal cancer, and first learned he had a second cancer battle to undergo, with Acute Myeloid Leukemia, after a routine visit to his oncologist.

"It was a combination of, 'Here we go again' and, 'How will I tell my wife?'" said Dave. A blood stem cell transplant was his best option for a cure, and he was fortunate that he had a perfectly matched donor in Gift of Life's registry.

Josh joined the registry in 2016 during UDance, the University of Delaware charity dance marathon held every spring. Josh, now 23 and a resident of Fort Lee, New Jersey, works in medical device sales. He was thrilled when he learned he was a match for someone in need.

"When I got the call I started tearing up at the thought of how lucky I was to be in this position," said Josh. "Donating was single-handedly the greatest thing I've ever done in my life."

The moment they met was highly emotional, with a lengthy hug, huge smiles, and not a dry eye among the nearly 80 Gift of Life employees in the crowd, as well as Dave and Josh's families. It was the perfect moment to show the incredible impact that our lifesaving mission has on those who receive transplants.

After the morning event, Josh and Dave and their families toured Gift of Life's facilities, including the donor collection suite where Josh donated his stem cells, then they spent the afternoon together enjoying South Florida.

"We have a unique bond that is more than enough to build a friendship on," said Dave. "It will be fascinating to see what else we have in common."

Josh urged others to join the registry, saying, "It only takes 10-15 seconds [of swabbing your cheek] to find out if you can save a life – that's one of the easiest decisions I've ever made. Being a donor is one of the greatest and most rewarding experiences anyone can ever have."

Transplant recipient Corbitt was excited and grateful when he met Abigail (Abby)
Weiss, whose stem cell donation in May 2019
saved his life. Gift of Life supporter Lynn
Schusterman, Founder and Chair Emerita of the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family
Philanthropies, introduced them. Abby joined the registry in 2014 during a drive at Tulane University and knew exactly what she was signing up to do: her father, Jeffrey, donated stem cells to a blood cancer patient in 2005, when Abby was only ten years old.

"It was a real privilege to be a match for you," Abby told Corbitt. "Hearing about your experience only deepens what I already felt, that it is super special to get to be a part of your story."

"[After having cancer] you reassess your values and what's important to you; you become much better at telling people you love them," said Corbitt. "I have changed a lot and I'm a better person now. It's fun to get a second chance – and you are an amazing soul."

The third annual Steven Bochco Award was presented by Steven's son, Jesse Bochco, to Gift of Life donor and volunteer Jared Stein. The award is presented to a Gift of Life volunteer who creatively uses their personal story to further the organization's life-saving mission. Jared joined the registry in 2011, and just over a year later donated stem cells to Jill Ginsberg, a 61-year-old woman battling non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. They met in 2015 at the first Celebrating Life event.

Thirty years ago, Gift of Life began as a grassroots effort to find a matching bone marrow donor for Jay Feinberg. After a four-year search for a match, Jay received a transplant to cure leukemia and dedicated his life to helping others find their donors. Gift of Life has now saved more than 4,000 lives, and has positively impacted thousands of their family members.

Grateful 16-year-old Meets His Lifesaving Donor at the Miami Gala

A Golden Beach, Fla. woman who donated life-saving peripheral blood stem cells to a gravely ill teen from Houston, Texas met the young man in an emotional introduction during the event. Yael Schlesinger, 54, joined the registry during a recruitment drive at the Michael-Ann Russell Jewish Community Center in North Miami Beach in 2005.

In 2017, Gift of Life matched her with the boy, then 12, who battled Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL) until receiving his stem cell transplant in Texas. Two years later, the donor gave a rare second donation of stem cells to help her recipient's recovery from cancer.

The boy, Sergio Reyes, now 16, his mother Liliana Reyes and his stepfather Jason Vargas traveled from Houston for the event. Sergio was fortunate that Yael was in the registry when needed, as only 45% of Hispanic/Latino patients find a matching donor vs. 95% of Caucasians. This event was the perfect opportunity for Gift of Life to raise awareness of this disparity and the urgent need to diversify the registry.

"I'm so happy I had the opportunity to help him," said Yael. "There is nothing to fear from donating; only good can come from it."

"We are so grateful to her for saving someone's life that she doesn't even know," the Liliana said of her son's heroic donor. "The world is not as small as we think. Another person is put there to be a special angel and save your loved one."

Also during the gala, Florida Blue was presented with the Corporate Partner Award for their ongoing and generous support of our lifesaving mission. The award was accepted by Senior Director of Business Development and Media Relations Doug Bartel.
















Gift of Life's Steps for Life 5k, held virtually in 2021, raises awareness of the need for blood stem cell and marrow donors to join the registry. Gift of Life uses the funds raised at the in-person and virtual events to add new donors to the registry. To date, these events have raised more than \$2,380,000 adding 16,850 new donors to the registry, resulting in 543 matches for patients and an incredible 88 lifesaving transplants.

During this year's event, participants came together from all over the world to run, walk, hold events and support our mission to save lives. Actress Jackie Burns was our host for both the online kickoff and closing ceremonies. Burns holds the title of Broadway's longest running Elphaba in WICKED. During the virtual ceremonies, viewers witnessed the heartwarming introductions of two transplant recipients to their heroic donors.



In 2021, Gift of Life's Young Professionals Committee hosted Celebrating Life virtually. This annual event honors donors and recipients, supporters, and their family and friends. Under normal cir-

cumstances, Gift of Life would bring a donor and recipient pair together in person during the program, but under pandemic conditions we did the next best thing: a virtual introduction so they would not have to wait any longer.

The event kicked off by recognizing hundreds of selfless individuals who donated during the pandemic. Many went to incredible lengths, traveled great distances, quarantined plus more in order to ensure their recipients would receive their lifesaving transplants on time.

The highlight of the evening was the moment when leukemia survivor Veronica Ruiz met her lifesaving bone marrow donor, Jennifer Winick. The two former strang-

ers will now always remember February 20, 2021 as a special day in their lives.

Michael Bohnen, President of the Adelson Family Foundation – long-time supporters of Gift of Life – made

this special and heartwarming introduction.

Jennifer, a 27-year-old resident of Manhattan, N.Y., joined Gift of Life during her Birthright Israel trip in May 2016, so she was already in the registry and ready to donate when the call came that she was a match.

The Young Professionals Committee consists of groups of emerging young leaders who dedicate their time, talents, networks and resources to our lifesaving mission. Volunteers in nine locations around the country engage in support activities in addition to Celebrating Life that include fundraising drives, donor recruitment drives and social occasions.

Event Chair Evie Goldfine, Celebrity Host Cris Carter

The Inaugural Gift of Life Golf Tournament was held on April 13, 2021 hosted by Gift of Life 15-year transplant recipient Evie Goldfine and Pro Football Hall of Famer Cris Carter. The pair kicked off the golf scramble in support of the organization's mission to save lives. The event featured foursomes with Carter and other former NFL players, including Dolphins Mark Duper and Jed Weaver.

The highlight of the event, held at The Breakers West Country Club in West Palm Beach, was when tourney participants witnessed the heartwarming, emotional meeting of bone marrow donor Jamie Lowe and his 3-year-old recipient Avery Cook.

Winter Springs, Fla. resident Jamie Lowe, 31, who donated to a gravely ill toddler, Avery Cook, joined the registry by ordering a swab kit online after seeing a segment about Gift of Life's mission on Chelsea Handler's Netflix show, "Chelsea" in 2016. Three years later he got the call that he was a match for a toddler fighting leukemia.

"I couldn't stop crying all day," said Jamie. "My mom passed from cancer at the end of 2012 and there was nothing we could do, we ran out of options. When I heard the news, I called my family and friends right away. I felt really lucky!"

Three-year-old Avery was diagnosed with Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia, the most common type of childhood cancer, when he was a year old. He went through treatment but relapsed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia, another fast-growing cancer of the blood and bone

marrow. His parents were devastated to learn that Avery needed a bone marrow transplant yet neither of them were a full match.

In 2019, Avery's doctors turned to the Gift of Life Marrow Registry, which thankfully found that Jamie was his tissue type match and was willing and able to make the donation.

Avery received his transplant at John Hopkins All Children's Hospital in St. Petersburg, Fla. and his parents are relieved to put that chapter behind them. "[Jamie] saved not only our baby, but our whole world," said Avery's mother Bailey Cook. "We will forever be grateful."



RECRUITING STUDENTS ON CAMPUS

The Gift of Life Campus Ambassador Program (CAP) is our primary approach to recruiting the crucial donor demographic of 18-to-25 year olds. Transplant centers request these donors most often as they give recipients the best chance of a successful result. Since CAP began in 2014, the program has found 1,993 matches for patients that have resulted in 245 completed transplants. There are currently eight donors who are also Campus Ambassadors in our program.

In 2021, our largest group of Campus Ambassadors ever, 563 college students, represented Gift of Life at 166 campuses across the United States.

Our CAPs were trained during live online sessions, covering topics from how to run a recruitment drive to making compelling presentations to working successfully with student organizations on campus. They're doing a tremendous job of recruiting new donors to join Gift of Life's registry in spite of the challenges presented by successive waves of the COVID-19 pandemic.


"The Call", featuring the story of a young man who learns he is a match for a patient and must decide. The comic book was created by Gift of Life Marrow Registry in collaboration with cartoonist Angus Cameron, and a PDF of the book is available to download from our website.

The comic was launched at Florida Supercon in Miami, where Gift of Life hosted a recruiting table and representatives swabbed an array of superheroes, helping to educate the public about our mission.

In a first for World Marrow Donor Day, Gift of Life arranged for Niagara Falls to be lit up orange after dark, providing a spectacular sight for both tourists on site and those watching the waterfall via the live webcam.

Miami Beach Police Department Holds "Swab2Save Day"







On September 23, 2021, two men connected by a shared immune system met for the first time at "Swab2Save Day" held at the Miami Beach Police Department (MBPD) headquarters. The special outdoor event featured an educational program

and a swabbing table where a number of people joined Gift of Life as volunteer donors. Speakers included the Mayor of Miami Beach Dan Gelber, Miami Beach Police Chief Richard Clements and Gift of Life Founder and CEO Jay Feinberg.

The highlight of the day was when 17-year-old Amir Ahmic and his mother Selma met, for the first time, the Gift of Life stem cell donor who saved Amir's life.

When Amir was only four months old he was diagnosed with an immune system disor-

der, Chronic Granulomatous Disease (CGD), where a type of white blood cell is unable to protect the body from infections. He spent his entire childhood in and out of hospitals, and as a teen also developed a second condition, ulcerative colitis. His doctors recommended a stem cell transplant in the hope of giving him a chance at a normal life.

His stem cell donor, David Marder, was found just a few weeks later in Gift of Life's registry. David joined the registry in 2014 while studying at a yeshiva in Israel. When he learned he was a match he had no hesitation about donating.



"When the opportunity to save a life presented itself there was never a choice," said David. "To help another person live is the most basic human trait."

The transplant took place in January 2019, but due to privacy regulations, the two, now so deeply connected, could not learn each other's identities for at least a year. The long-awaited moment when David and Amir were introduced to each other by Mayor Gelber was deeply emotional, and mom Selma's tears of joy were the high point of the morning.

"You really changed my life completely," said Amir, "It's been a great day today and I'm really thankful."

"Our whole family is thankful to you for stepping up," said Selma. "You helped a young man that you never met in your life, someone that you didn't know."




